### Governor Baker's Performance on Equitable Reopening Policies

<p><b>Data Shows Infection Rates Dropping for All Groups</b></p>	<p>A. = Necessary data is available and rates are dropping for all groups, including those that have experienced a disproportionate burden, including to Black and Latinx residents, people with disabilities, residents of the most impacted municipalities, workers in front line occupations, people who do not speak English, and LGBTQ+ residents.</p> <p>B. = Necessary data is available and is mostly trending in the right direction, but not for all groups</p> <p>C. = Partial data is available and improvements in data transparency are underway. Alternatively, necessary data is available and infection rates are holding steady for the most impacted groups.</p> <p><b>D. = Partial data available, but and no data improvements are being made. Alternatively, necessary data is available and infection rates are going up for some or all groups.</b></p> <p>F. = Necessary data is not available and not improving; unknown whether rates are dropping for the most impacted groups.</p>
<p><b>Enforceable Protections for Workers + Support for Small Businesses</b></p>	<p>A. = 4 conditions have been met: 1) Additional funding has been allocated for workplace safety enforcement; 2) Financial support is available for small businesses to meet safety standards; 3) Guidelines have been amended to allow for timely enforcement of serious safety violations; and 4) Guidelines have been amended to require a worksite-specific safety assessment and clear voice for workers.</p> <p>B. = 3 conditions have been met.</p> <p>C. = 2 of the conditions have been met.</p> <p>D. = 1 condition has been met.</p> <p><b>F. = None of the conditions have been met.</b></p>
<p><b>Accelerate &amp; Expand Testing</b></p>	<p>A. = 3 conditions have been met: 1) State is on track to meet testing benchmark of 45,000 tests/day by July 31<sup>st</sup>; 2) Testing is widely available to asymptomatic people at high risk free of charge; 3) The Administration has clear criteria for testing that includes high risk asymptomatic people and they are communicating the guidance in a high-profile way.</p> <p>B. = Conditions 2) <u>and</u> 3) are met; overall daily test numbers are trending upwards.</p> <p>C. = Condition 2) <u>or</u> 3) is met; overall daily test numbers are trending upwards.</p> <p><b>D. = 1 condition met. Or, plan developed to meet conditions but has not yet been implemented.</b></p> <p>F. = None of the conditions have been met.</p>
<p><b>A Seat at the Table</b></p>	<p>A. = A Recovery Advisory Board has been appointed and the most impacted groups and local public health are well represented.</p> <p>B. = NA</p> <p>C. = A Recovery Advisory Board has been appointed, but the most impacted groups and local public health are absent or not well represented.</p> <p>D. = NA</p> <p><b>F. = A Recovery Advisory Board has not been appointed.</b></p>
